



MAJOR CHOSEN: HUMANITIES

I. A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE MAJOR

Your Humanities major will prepare you for a number of career options that call for a broadly based, comprehensive college education. Rather than focusing on one or two academic disciplines, it will expose you to a variety of courses in the arts and sciences. It calls for studies in English, philosophy, foreign language, history, mathematics, science, art, music, and speech, to name but a few. Thus, it will provide a solid, well-rounded college education while allowing you to postpone specialization until you enter graduate studies or a chosen career. A special feature of this major is the large number of elective hours which allows you to select ten to twelve courses in different areas of your choice.

II. COURSE HIGHLIGHTS

Here are some of the courses you will especially enjoy:

English A total of 18 credit hours of composition and literature is prescribed, including British literature and American literature. You may also choose from classes such as Shakespeare, Chaucer, Milton, American Romantic Literature, British Novel, Modern Drama, or Modern Poetry.

Fine Arts A total of 13 credit hours is prescribed in the areas of speech, art, and music. Some of these classes would include Fundamentals of Speech, Appreciation of Music, Appreciation of Art, and Oral Communication for the Professions.

History A total of 12 credit hours is prescribed in the area of history including classes in History of Civilization. Other choices of classes could be United States History, Rome, French Revolution and Napoleon, Russia, Renaissance, History of Latin America, or Civil War and Reconstruction.

III. A TYPICAL YEARLY COURSE SEQUENCE

This is a suggested program of study for you. Other refinements to your program can be made when you consult your faculty advisor at the time of your enrollment.

You will notice that some courses are listed as electives. These electives give you the opportunity to tailor your program by selecting courses you would like to take for your own personal enjoyment.

IV. FACILITIES, EQUIPMENT, AND OPPORTUNITIES

Our Modern Language Laboratory, open six days a week, contains the latest state-of-the-art recording and listening equipment, providing you with a unique opportunity to perfect your language skills. We have 28 individual tape player/recorder stations plus another 7 stations which are serviced by a control console. Thus, we have the capacity to play 30 different programs at any given time. You may use these facilities without paying a lab fee.

Completely equipped computer laboratories are available for your use. There are many academic computer labs conveniently located all over campus. They consist of various types of PCs, Apple PowerMacs, and laser printers and are all interconnected via a Novell computer network.



Biology, chemistry, physics and electronics labs that are well equipped and up-to-date will be available to you. Among the ample and excellent equipment you will find not only materials and devices commonly required for routine undergraduate science experiments, but also a substantial number of high-quality microscopes, a refrigerated super-speed centrifuge, equipment for videotaping through a microscope, high-resolution color monitors, and sophisticated spectrophotometers (atomic absorption/emission, ultraviolet-visible) as well as gas and modular high-pressure liquid chromatographs.

The University Debate Association provides opportunity for you to compete in debate as a member of your society. Each society participates in several elimination contests throughout the school year to determine the winner of the University cup which is awarded during Commencement week. The University also sponsors debate teams which compete in the National Cross-Examination Debate Association tournaments several times throughout the year. Over the years our teams have established an outstanding record and an excellent reputation in competition at the national and regional levels.

All students have opportunity to participate in the University's athletic program. Through a well-integrated program of intramural athletic competition, a very high percentage of student participation is possible. You will have the opportunity to compete in a wide variety of both team and individual sports including soccer, speedball, basketball, softball, track, volleyball, tennis, swimming, badminton, judo, table tennis, racquetball, archery, wrestling, and indoor soccer.

There are nine art studio/classrooms, which include large, well-lighted drawing, painting, and design studios. We also have completely equipped printmaking and crafts studios and a large ceramics studio with four kilns.

Our music facilities are the finest to be found in Fundamental Christian education today. In fact, they are equal to and, in many cases, exceed what is found in the finest secular universities and conservatories. These include 30 faculty teaching studios, more than 60 student practice studios (35 equipped and specially designated for music majors and minors and advanced students), 5 rehearsal/classrooms, a music education laboratory/classroom, a piano pedagogy lab, a class piano lab equipped with 15 Roland electronic pianos, 2 beautiful recital halls, and 2 large auditoriums for major concerts and oratorio and opera performances.

The productions of the *University Classic Players* and *Opera Association* will enable you in four years to see several Shakespearean plays and grand operas performed on campus. Every year there are also frequent recitals and student performances in theater, speech, and music.

Davis Field House, with over 87,000 square feet and seating for 3,000 people, contains 4 full-sized courts; auxiliary courts; indoor and outdoor tracks; swimming pool; café; and a fitness center with fully-equipped exercise room, aerobic room, sauna, and whirlpool.

Chapel is one of the most interesting features of Bob Jones University. This 35-minute service is held every morning, Monday through Thursday. These services are a source of great inspiration to students. Four days a week the Chapel message is brought by the President or Executive Vice President when on campus, and in their absence by selected speakers. Each Friday the Chapel period is devoted to the meetings of various literary societies.



The Mack Library, with 90,000 square feet of floor space and seating for over 1,300 students, gives you access to 283,000 volumes, 1,100 current periodical subscriptions, and more than 15,200 music, speech, and language recordings. An interlibrary loan program is available through OCLC, a national database, for books not held in our library. Other prominent features include the Jerusalem Chamber, a replica of the room in Westminster Abbey in London in which work was accomplished on the 1611 King James Bible, and the University Archives Room which displays materials about the Founder and history of the University.

If you are planning to live on campus, you will be glad to know that all of our residence halls are air-conditioned, have wall-to-wall carpeting, and have a phone in each room. You will be able to make long-distance calls directly from your room and have them automatically placed on your school bill. Computer network connectivity is available in all residence halls, as well.

All of our classrooms are air-conditioned, and there are awnings over the sidewalks to keep you dry when it is raining. The Dining Common serves 8,500 delicious meals a day, and the Snack Shop and Bookstore in the Student Center carry just about anything you'll need.

You will find the finest Christian young people in the country are your fellow students, and without trying too hard, you may end up making a lifelong friend!

V. ABOUT THE FACULTY

Because of the variety of its curriculum, the Humanities major draws faculty from several of the schools in the University. You will have opportunity to learn from experts with graduate degrees in their respective fields. Many of our faculty have advanced degrees and years of teaching experience.

VI. CAREER OPPORTUNITIES AND PLACEMENT

Humanities majors find employment with companies who prefer to hire people with a strong, comprehensive liberal arts education whom they can train in specific job responsibilities. In fact, more and more businesses and even professional schools are intensifying their call for college graduates who are thoroughly educated in those areas that are important to man as a human being rather than merely a skilled craftsman or even professional. Thus humanities majors often work in people-oriented careers such as banking, public relations, advertising, the airline industry, community services, government agencies, etc., because of their ability to relate to people and discern and establish relationships. You could be used in an area where a high value is placed on displaying a wide awareness and the ability to think logically and critically.
