



MAJOR CHOSEN: ART EDUCATION

I. A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE MAJOR

The purpose of the Art Education major is to train students to nurture and develop the creative abilities and knowledge of art in their students from pre-kindergarten to twelfth grade. You will learn the characteristics of learners and how to approach the teaching of the subject of art. We also help our graduates develop their own proficiencies in art.

II. COURSE HIGHLIGHTS

Here are some of the courses you will especially enjoy:

Teaching Art (Elementary) and Secondary School Art These two classes will teach you how to instruct young people creatively in the various art media according to their age groups and their levels of ability. Emphasis is placed on motivating creative ability as well as learning to use the vocabulary of art and developing artistic responses in young people to works of art.

Directed Teaching Here you will have a chance to "try your wings" by teaching under the supervision of an experienced teacher. You will begin gradually and work into handling a teacher's normal load.

Drawing and Structural Representation In this course you will receive studio training in beginning drawing and the graphic representation of three-dimensional forms. A concentrated study of perspective is followed by experience with proportions and the description of form with light and shade.

Basic Painting Using oil paint you will begin painting the still life with an awareness of light and shadow relationships, the rendering of texture and form, and the study of composition.

III. A TYPICAL YEARLY COURSE SEQUENCE

This is a suggested program of study for you. Other refinements to your program can be made when you consult your faculty advisor at the time of your enrollment.

You will notice that some courses are listed as electives. These electives give you the opportunity to tailor your program by selecting courses you would like to take for your own personal enjoyment.

IV. FACILITIES, EQUIPMENT, AND OPPORTUNITIES

Some requests from the Greenville community for artists will be referred to qualified students. Qualified students will be referred to families in town for private tutoring opportunities. Students also work with children in the University's Child Development Center and/or the Elementary and Middle School late stay program.



Your program of studies will include art instruction in drawing, painting, fiber arts, printmaking and ceramics as well as other media. Instruction is given on a professional level to enable you to develop your skill in an area of art at which you excel. You will study art in eight large, well-lit studio/classrooms including drawing, painting, and design studios, an art education lab, a ceramics studio, a fully equipped framing shop, and completely equipped printmaking and fiber arts studios. Your teachers will all be Christian men and women who are active professionally in their subject matter and enjoy sharing their knowledge with you.

You will also be able to gain inspiration and stimulation by a study of some of the world's greatest artists in the Bob Jones University Museum and Gallery. This collection, including works by Botticelli, Rembrandt, Rubens, Titian, Van Dyck, Vasari, and Vignali, has been acclaimed the most extensive collection of sacred art in the Western Hemisphere.

Each school year the University sponsors a Commencement Contest in which art students have an opportunity to compete. If you work hard and apply what you have learned, you might win this award while you are here.

The Association of Christian Teachers is an integral part of the School of Education. Films, programs, and activities are correlated very closely to the emphasis of the individual classes. This organization will provide you with opportunities for leadership training and professional contact. Each of the 12 professional education departments elects representatives to serve as officers. Prospective teachers are urged to become members of the A.C.T. The A.C.T. awards a medal annually to the best elementary student teacher and best secondary student teacher. By doing your best while you are a student here, you might be able to win that award.

The Media Center contains all the audiovisual equipment you are likely to use in teaching, including equipment for preparing transparencies, videotapes, laminated bulletin board figures, powerpoint and multi-media instructional programs, signs, and duplicating equipment. You will learn how to use these various machines under the guidance of our trained and dedicated staff. The Media Center is also equipped with various curriculum materials, textbooks, and teaching materials for all grade levels and subjects.

Completely equipped computer laboratories are available for your use. There are many academic computer labs conveniently located all over campus. They consist of various types of computers, and both color and black and white printers and are all interconnected via a Novell computer network. The Sargent Art Building is equipped with a graphic design lab with new eMacs and art software such as Adobe Illustrator, InDesign, and Photoshop. Scanners and color printers enable students to print their creations.

You will have the opportunity to observe experienced Christian teachers right on our campus in the beautiful buildings of Bob Jones Beginnings Center (kindergarten and first grade), Elementary School, Junior High, and Academy.

The productions of the *University Classic Players* and *Opera Association* will enable you in four years to see several Shakespearean plays and grand operas performed on campus. Every year there are undergraduate and graduate art exhibitions as well as an annual Faculty art exhibit. Trips are organized to give students an opportunity to visit world-renowned collections such as the High Museum of Art in Atlanta, The National Gallery in Washington D. C., or the Art Institute of Chicago.

Because of our care and concern for the spiritual as well as the physical needs of the people in our part of the country, students are encouraged to be involved in outreach ministries in our area. While you are here



you will have the opportunity to participate in as many of these ministries as you can fit into your schedule. These opportunities vary from work in nursing homes, jails, detention centers, and churches, to visitation, Bible clubs, providing special music, and martial arts teams.

Chapel is a central feature of Bob Jones University. This 35-minute service is held every morning, Monday through Thursday. These services are a source of great inspiration to students. Four days a week the Chapel message is brought by the President or by selected speakers. Each Friday the Chapel period is devoted to the meetings of various literary societies.

Davis Field House, with over 87,000 square feet and seating for 3,000 people, contains 4 full-sized courts; auxiliary courts; indoor and outdoor tracks; swimming pool; café; and a fitness center with fully-equipped exercise room, aerobic room, sauna, and whirlpool.

The Mack Library, with 90,000 square feet of floor space and seating for over 1,300 students, gives you access to 294,000 volumes, 1,100 current periodical subscriptions, and more than 17,000 music, speech, and language recordings. Mack Library offers access to over 65 electronic databases on the library web site. An interlibrary loan program is available through OCLC, a national database, for books not held in our library. The Textbook section of the library contains samples of current textbooks in the field of art on both the elementary and secondary level for your use. Other prominent features include the Jerusalem Chamber, a replica of the room in Westminster Abbey in London in which work was accomplished on the 1611 King James Bible, and the University Archives Room which displays materials about the Founder and history of the University.

If you are planning to live on campus, you will be glad to know that all of our residence halls are air-conditioned, have wall-to-wall carpeting, and have a phone in each room. You will be able to make long-distance calls directly from your room and have them automatically placed on your school bill. Computer network connectivity is available in all residence halls, as well.

All of our classrooms are air-conditioned, and there are awnings over the sidewalks to keep you dry when it is raining. The Dining Common serves 8,500 delicious meals a day, and the Snack Shop and Bookstore in the Student Center carry just about anything you'll need, including basic art supplies.

You will find the finest Christian young people in the country are your fellow students, and without trying too hard, you may end up making a life-long friend!

V. ABOUT THE FACULTY

You will receive personal attention from the ten godly men and women who comprise the art faculty. Their graduate work represents such schools as *The South Carolina Governor's School of the Arts, Graduate Program, East Tennessee State University*, and *Bob Jones University*. Their average number of years of teaching experience is 20; and their specialties include drawing, painting, design, advertising design, illustration, calligraphy, printmaking, sculpture, ceramics, crafts, and art education.

All of our art faculty are practicing artists, exhibiting regularly and winning significant awards. Some of the awards that have been won include first award of merit, Upstate Visual Arts members' exhibition; a merit award in the Southeastern Art Competition and the prestigious Wyoming Conservation Stamp Award. One faculty member received first place at the La Luz National Miniature Show, La Luz, New Mexico. Another has written a secondary level art textbook, *Our Christian Heritage in Art*.



VI. CAREER OPPORTUNITIES AND PLACEMENT

As an art education graduate, these career fields will be open to you:

Teaching Art (K-12 grade, Christian and public school)
Adult Education and/or Special Education (handicapped) with graduate training

The Career Development and Placement Office helps students by holding seminars on resume preparation and interview techniques.

A Principals' Recruitment Conference is sponsored by the Career Development and Placement Office each February. Approximately 140 administrators and principals from many states and some foreign countries gather to interview and hire new teachers for their schools. This conference will give you many opportunities to find a place of service after you graduate. In addition, the Career Office maintains a file of miscellaneous information about various Christian schools across the country. This file, too, may provide you with a contact that could lead to many years of active service for the Lord.
