



MAJOR CHOSEN: TWO-DIMENSIONAL ART

I. A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE MAJOR

As an Art major, you will be prepared for a career in fine arts and illustration. You will take a core of courses in drawing and design to sharpen your perceptive skills and to lay a solid technical foundation for advanced work. You will then concentrate your study in the areas of drawing, painting and printmaking. Art instruction is given without additional cost above the regular tuition.

II. COURSE HIGHLIGHTS

Here are some of the courses you will especially enjoy:

Drawing and Structural Representation In this course you will receive studio training in beginning drawing and the graphic representation of three-dimensional forms working from actual objects. A concentrated study of perspective is followed by experience with proportions and form description with light and shade.

Basic Painting Using oil paint you will begin painting the still life with an awareness of light and shadow relationships, the rendering of texture and form, and the study of composition. Other painting subjects include the landscape and interpretative imagery.

Printmaking Various artistic printing techniques are explored. Drawings are executed on lithographic stones and aluminum plates and printed in color and black and white. In this course, you will produce collagraphs, etchings, aquatints, photoetchings, linocuts and silk screen prints.

III. A TYPICAL YEARLY COURSE SEQUENCE

This is a suggested program of study for you. Other refinements to your program can be made when you consult your faculty advisor at the time of your enrollment.



You will notice that some courses are listed as electives. These electives give you the opportunity to tailor your program by selecting courses you would like to take for your own personal enjoyment.

IV. FACILITIES, EQUIPMENT, AND OPPORTUNITIES

The Art Wing of the Dwight Gustafson Fine Arts Center houses ten art studio/classrooms which include large, well-lit drawing, painting, and design studios; completely equipped printmaking and craft studios; an education lab/classroom; a large ceramics studio with four kilns; a sculpture studio/woodshop; a foundry; and a computer lab with 25 state-of-the-art graphic design workstations.

As an advanced art student, you may have opportunity to receive training in Creative Services, a Public Liaison department which prepares some of the graphic artwork for the University and the University Press, a publishing and printing establishment.

Our students participate in campus and regional exhibitions. In comparison with secular schools, our program ranks highly. Our students have consistently won major awards in student competitions.

The Bob Jones University Museum and Gallery houses a world-renowned collection of sacred art, the most extensive collection in the Western Hemisphere. You will be able to receive inspiration and stimulation by studying the works in this collection.

Fine Arts Contests in music, speech, art, and literature are held annually, and all students have an opportunity to compete in them. Awards are given to winners in the field of piano, men's voice, women's voice, organ, string, woodwind, brass, original oratory, dramatic reading, poetry, art, photography, extemporaneous essay, and original hymn text writing.

Modern Language Club is a trilingual organization composed of students taking courses in French, German, and Spanish. You will be taking a modern language and will, therefore, have opportunity to participate in this club. It is the purpose of the club to stimulate an increased interest in the foreign languages and culture. In an informal atmosphere of entertainment, discussion, games, and reports, you will gain valuable information and insight to further your knowledge and language skills.

Davis Field House, with over 87,000 square feet and seating for 3,000 people, contains 4 full-sized courts; auxiliary courts; indoor and outdoor tracks; swimming pool; café; and a fitness center with fully-equipped exercise room, aerobic room, sauna, and whirlpool.

Completely equipped computer laboratories are available for your use. There are many academic computer labs conveniently located all over campus. They consist of various types of PCs, Apple PowerMacs, and laser printers and are all interconnected via a Novell computer network.

All students have opportunity to participate in the University's athletic program. Through a well-integrated program of intramural athletic competition, a very high percentage of student participation is possible. You will have the opportunity to compete in a wide variety of both team and individual sports including soccer, basketball, softball, volleyball, tennis, badminton, racquetball, and water polo.

Chapel is a central feature of Bob Jones University. This 35-minute service is held every morning, Monday through Thursday. These services are a source of great inspiration to students. Four days a week the Chapel message is brought by the President or by selected speakers. Each Friday the Chapel period is devoted to the meetings of various literary societies.



The Mack Library covers 89, 000 square feet of floor space and has seating for over 1,300 students. It provides you with 318, 000 items, including 17,000 music recordings, 70 electronic databases through the library website, and over 1,100 current periodical titles. In addition, the library participates in the statewide PASCAL Delivers program, allowing students to check out books from a statewide catalog of over nine million books. An interlibrary loan program for out of state borrowing is available through OCLC, a national database for books not held in our library. Other prominent features include the Jerusalem Chamber, a replica of a room in London's Westminster Abby in which work was done on the 1611 King James Bible, and the University Archives Room which displays materials about the Founder and the history of Bob Jones University.

If you are planning to live on campus, you will be glad to know that all of our residence halls are air-conditioned, have wall-to-wall carpeting, and have a phone in each room. You will be able to make long-distance calls directly from your room and have them automatically placed on your school bill. Computer network connectivity is available in all residence halls, as well.

All of our classrooms are air-conditioned, and most sidewalks are covered to keep you dry when it is raining. The Dining Common serves 8,500 delicious meals a day, and the Snack Shop and Campus Store in the Student Center carry just about anything you'll need.

You will find the finest Christian young people in the country are your fellow students, and without trying too hard, you may end up making a life-long friend!

V. ABOUT THE FACULTY

You will receive personal attention from the ten godly men and women who comprise the art faculty. Their average number of years of teaching experience is 20; and their specialties include drawing, painting, design, advertising design and illustration, calligraphy, printmaking, sculpture, ceramics, crafts, and art education.

All of our art faculty are practicing artists, exhibiting regularly and winning significant awards. Some of the awards that have been won include "Best in Show" at the Annual South Carolina Artists Guild, the Terminix Merit Award in the South Carolina Watercolor Society annual exhibition, and "Best in Show" at the Hunter Annual sponsored by the Hunter Museum in Chattanooga, Tennessee. One faculty member received first place at the La Luz National Miniature Show, La Luz, New Mexico. Another has work on display at the Blatt Senate Building in Columbia, South Carolina as well as being represented with three works in the South Carolina Arts Commission Collection.

VI. CAREER OPPORTUNITIES AND PLACEMENT

As a graduate from our art program, you will have the opportunity to go on to a career as a studio artist, or as a designer and illustrator in advertising and in the publishing industry. A number of our graduates are working for Christian publication firms and others are in secular positions in commercial illustration and design. A student intern position may lead to work in sales gallery/frame shop or museum employment.
