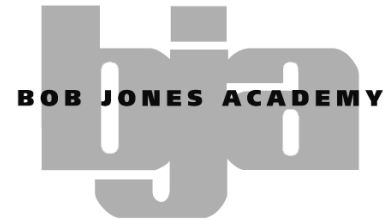

6. Communication

- a. **By phone:** Cell phones are not permitted. Since THE WILDS has only a business phone, please do not ask your parents or friends to call you at camp. You may not use the phone to make calls to friends or family back home. Phone calls are for emergencies only.

THE WILDS Senior Class Trip

Oct. 6-10, 2008

We have an exciting week planned for the senior class of 2009. As you probably know already, the senior trip is Oct. 6–10. Please read this booklet carefully, and if you have a specific problem or have a question regarding the trip, see Dr. White.

1. Preparing for the trip

- a. Return your permission form to the Academy office by Wednesday, Sept. 24. Residence hall students, please have your parents access this form on our website (www.bju.edu/bja). They may e-mail a completed form to ewhite@bj.edu or fax it to 864-271-7278.
- b. If you are working, make arrangements with your employer immediately since all seniors are expected to go on the trip.
- c. If you are enrolled in any classes that are not specifically senior courses, or if you are enrolled in a university class, you should see your teachers very soon to get the assignments for the week of the trip. You must make up the work for these courses before you go on the trip.
- d. If you are taking music lessons, please let your music teacher know ahead of time that you will be going on the trip.
- e. Day students: If you wish to leave your car parked on campus while you are gone, you must leave it in the area designated for regular Academy parking. If there is no campus sticker on your car, you will need to go by the Welcome Center in advance and secure a temporary parking permit.

2. What to bring...

- Bible and notebook
- Bedding, pillow, towels, toiletries
- Warm clothes (for cool evenings)
- Tennis shoes
- Water shoes/sandals
- Soccer cleats (guys)
- Rain gear
- Plastic bag (for wet clothing on the return trip)
- Spending money (for the snack shop, craft shop, WILDS shirts or souvenirs)

Do NOT Bring...cell phones, radios, ipods, video cameras, guitars or magazines.

**You may only bring one suitcase, a sleeping bag and a pillow. Girls may also bring a cosmetic case if necessary. Be sure to put your name on all your belongings, including your bedding and pillow.

3. Leaving campus

- a. Seniors will attend Monday classes as usual.
- b. Meet in front of the Academy Main promptly at 4:15 p.m. to begin loading the buses. Only pillows and backpacks may be carried on the bus.
- c. Luggage
 - i. All luggage and sleeping bags will be sent up on the luggage truck.
 - ii. Mr. Weathers will provide ribbons to attach to sleeping bags and luggage.
 - iii. Label all luggage and sleeping bags with your name on duct or masking tape.
 - iv. Residence hall women: you may bring your sleeping bag and luggage to the back of Mary Gaston by 4 p.m. sharp for pickup. If you are late, you will have to carry your own luggage to the Academy.
 - v. All men and town women: bring your sleeping bag, pillow and one piece of luggage to the lobby of the Academy Auditorium by 4:15 p.m. on Monday.
- d. We will leave campus at 4:45 p.m.

4. Returning to campus: We will be returning to the Academy on Friday, Oct. 10, at approximately 11:45 a.m.

5. What to wear

Evening Services	Skirts or dresses (Denim is acceptable.)
Activities	Loose-fitting fashions that cover the knee (pants, jeans, capris, overalls)
