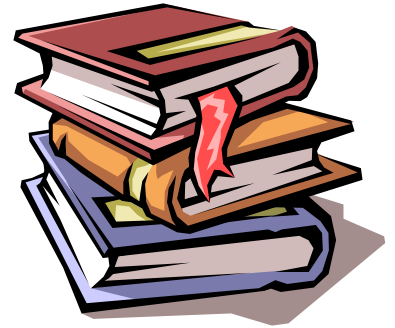
Things Every Junior High Student Should Know...

Absences It is the student's responsibility to make up any work missed due to absence from school. Please see your teacher immediately upon returning to school to make arrangements.

Arrival The cafeteria opens at 7:30 each morning for a supervised Early Stay. If you arrive before 7:50, please come to the cafeteria to be dismissed to your lockers and homeroom. Be in your homeroom before the 7:58 bell rings.

Assignment Sheet A weekly assignment sheet will be distributed in homeroom every Friday morning. Extra copies are available in the office and online at www.bju.edu/bjrh and at www.edline.net.

Book Covers All hardback textbooks must have a cover on them at all times.



Candy/Gum Students may not eat candy or chew gum while on campus. This includes when walking to and from Chapel, in the Gym, on the fields, etc. Lunch and Late Stay are the exceptions for candy - but not for gum. "Candy" includes mints, "tic-tacs", "altoids", etc.

Car Line/Late Stay School is dismissed at 2:55 each afternoon. At that point, students who are meeting their rides must come out to the curb quickly to meet their ride. Students going to Late Stay should go straight to the cafeteria and not stand in the car line.

Cell Phones, Cameras, and PDAs Cell phones are not permitted in any classrooms, nor may they be carried to Chapel. Cell phones can be used during the school day ONLY with permission from the school office. Cell phones can be used in Late Stay only with permission from the supervisor. Cameras (or the camera function on a phone or PDA) are only permitted for these special circumstances: class trips, excursion, and year-end picnic.

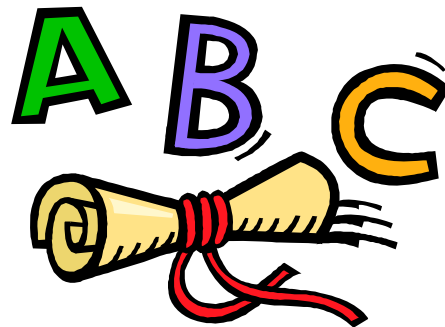
Students may not use cell phones, cameras, or PDAs to play games, send text messages, connect to the wireless internet, play music, or take photos while on school property. Students will lose the privilege of having a device at school if it is used improperly.

Dress Code Details of the dress code are covered on pages 10-14 of the parent/student handbook. The dress code is to help each of us be responsible for how we look and present ourselves each day. Please be aware of your responsibilities - and meet them!

Extension Junior High students have a ministry opportunity every week - we call it "extension." On Wednesdays right after school, students meet in the Bible classroom (107) to prepare for the trip to Pendleton Manor, a local nursing home. The students participate by singing, visiting with residents, providing special music, and reading the Bible. We focus on taking two homerooms every week, but as long as we have seats available on the bus, anyone may come along.

Grading Scale Our teachers typically use the following system of grading. The scale may vary from one teacher to another; this is just a suggested pattern. Pay attention to the information that your teacher provides at the beginning of the year.

A = 93-100
B = 85-92
C = 77-84
D = 70-76
F = 0-69
I = incomplete



Library Junior High students have their own library, which is open in the afternoons. Library books can be checked out for two weeks. A special section of the library containing only reference books is located in the Junior High building.

Lockers Each student receives at least two lockers - one in the Junior High building and one in the gym. Lockers are personal areas - DO NOT share your combinations with anyone! Please do not use anything to "jam" your locker open, and do not use tape inside your locker.



Prohibited Items Some items, while they may be appropriate at home or other places, would be inappropriate - and sometimes even dangerous - in a school setting. As such, please do not bring the following items to school: hand-held video/computer games, skateboards, magazines or catalogs of any kind, pagers, radios, "sharpies" or any permanent markers, laser pointers, ipods, tape/CD/MP3/DVD players, unacceptable tapes/CDs/DVDs, fireworks, knives, correction fluid, nail polish, playing cards, trading cards (any type), and guns or weapons of any kind. This list can change as needed.

Questions? If you have a question, always feel free to ask your teachers or to stop by the office at any time. Everyone is here to help you succeed - please speak up if you need any assistance!

Sports Tuesdays and Thursdays after school from 3:15-4:30. Anyone who wants to play sports (first soccer, then basketball, and finally volleyball), should plan to attend the "try-out" days. At the try-outs, the coaches will rank the players and then assign everyone to a team. Team lists and game and practice schedules will be posted, and the season will begin. Both soccer and basketball end with championship games. Parents are welcome and encouraged to attend all games.



Tardies Everyone has a personal responsibility to be on time. In the morning, please be IN your homeroom when the 7:58 bell rings. Likewise, we all have a responsibility to each other to be on time for each class. Always be on time!
