*Please Read Carefully*

We trust that your student is looking forward to the upcoming Williamsburg trip. The faculty members are anticipating a good time touring Colonial Williamsburg and fellowshiping with the students in an informal atmosphere. We also realize, however, the great responsibility we have taken upon ourselves to properly supervise your child.

With that responsibility in mind, please go over the following information carefully with your child and counsel him about the importance of abiding by the guidelines established by BJH and his chaperons.

### **Pack Wisely...**

Layers work well to accommodate daily temperature changes.

Boys should wear school clothes.

Girls may wear **loose-fitting** slacks—not jeans.

Girls may not wear hip-huggers.

No baggy or oversize clothing

Comfortable shoes (not new)

Winter coat

Small umbrella

Bathing suit...Depending on the weather and the number of motel guests, we may permit the students to use the indoor pool. There will be separate times for boys and girls. If you wish your student to use the pool, please pack a bathing suit and a plastic bag. Girls' bathing suits must be modest and one piece. Girls also need something to wear over their bathing suits to and from the pool. Sweat suits work well for this.

### **Suitcase...**

One medium-size suitcase—no overnight bags, hanging bags, etc., in addition to the suitcase.

**Do Not Bring...**Radios, tape recorders, iPods headphones, walkie-talkies, CD, MP3 or DVD players, laptops, stuffed animals, books or magazines that would not be acceptable at the junior high, or irons (irons will be provided in each room).

**You May Bring...**electronic games, but no games that connect to TV—sound turned off.

### **Cell Phones...**

Students are permitted to bring cell phones on the trip. We ask that the phones only be used for emergency situations, or for calling home. We will set aside a time each evening for students to call home and give parents an update. We ask that students not use the phones to call or text message each other at any point during the trip. During the touring times, we ask that phones be set to silent alarm so that they are not a distraction to presentations, demonstrations, or discussions.

### **Film and Batteries...**

Bring your film and batteries from home (the cost is much higher in Williamsburg).

### **Money...**

Students will need money for eight fast food-type meals, souvenirs, and tips. A hearty breakfast buffet is included in the price of the motel. The price of the same breakfast in the dining room is \$10. Students should plan to tip 10% of \$10 for three days.

### **Bus...**

A **small** bag or backpack with snacks may be carried on the bus; however, we are asking that drinks (other than water) be consumed only at rest stops. Students may drink water on the bus.

### **Emergency Calls...**

The Junior High office will have the hotel phone number. Please call only in an emergency.

### **Christian Testimony...**

It is very important that your student be aware of his/her testimony at all times. We have worked hard to be a witness for the Lord and to establish good relationships with our contacts in Williamsburg. We do not want anyone or anything to prevent Christ being seen in our students.
